Student Success Beyond K-12 is What Matters



GRADUATION RATE

Kansas graduation rates have increased in all subgroups, including English language learners, students with disabilities and free/reduced lunch.

POSTSECONDARY SUCCESS

Kansas has seen a 7% increase in students completing or remaining enrolled in postsecondary education after high school . 7% increase

35,785 students

POSTSECONDARY ENROLLMENT

In 2023, an all-time high of 35,785 high school students took a postsecondary course while in high school.

POSTSECONDARY CREDITS EARNED

In 2023, high school students earned 306,904 credits while in high school. This is an all-time high.





POSTSECONDARY REMEDIAL ENROLLMENT

Enrollment in remedial coursework for students ages 17-22 has decreased 30% at community colleges and 40% at state universities since 2010.

WORKFORCE READY

Kansas needs 73% of workers to have a postsecondary certificate or degree.
