# **Kansas Communities that Care Survey**

Current Blue Valley students in 6th, 8th, 10th and 12th grades are invited to take the Kansas Communities That Care student survey in January 2023.

Blue Valley has participated in this survey for many years, and continued participation allows our staff to understand yearly trends, measuring the effect that our prevention and responsive programming has on our students.

The Kansas Communities That Care student survey is offered by schools across Kansas and is supported by Greenbush Education Service Center and the Kansas Department for Aging and Disability Services. The survey is built on a framework of prevention to support effective, evidence-based strategies in Kansas communities. The survey is voluntary, and parents or guardians must complete a form granting permission for their student to take the survey.

Questions for the Kansas Communities That Care Survey (KCTC Survey) can be found on the <u>district</u> <u>website</u> under "useful links." Questions are related to substance use, school climate, bullying, depression, and suicide. The survey is completely anonymous, and no identifying student personal information is collected. The Blue Valley School District receives data summarized by school and our overall district results.

## **Illness Guidelines**

Cold and flu season has arrived! LMS and the district at large has seen a spike in influenza and illness. Many viruses start with vague complaints and are most contagious during the first 48 hours. Coming to school ill exposes classmates and staff to infection. Keep your student home for treatment, rest and observation if they have any of the following symptoms:

- Fever (greater than 100)\*\*
- Vomiting (even once and even if they feel better after)\*\*
- Diarrhea (2 or more loose stools)\*\*
- Chills
- · General malaise, fatigue, body aches
- Frequent congested (wet) or croupy cough
- · Significant sore throat

As a reminder, the health room  $\emph{does not stock}$  cold or cough medications, decongestants, antihistamines, cough syrups or Mucinex. These should be given at home. Thank you! Amy Hamera, BSN, RN Nurse, Leawood Middle School
