Student Checkout Process

Need to check out your student for an appointment, leaving town, or for personal reasons? Please be sure to follow our best practice guidelines below:

- Please send a note with your student to be turned into the front office first thing in the
 morning. It can be as simple as a handwritten note on a scratch piece of paper. The office will
 in turn write a pass for ten minutes prior to your stated arrival time to ensure they are in the
 office, signed out, and ready to go for dismissal.
- Forgot to write a note or scheduled a last minute or unknown pickup? No worries. Just show your ID at the door upon arrival, and the office will call the classroom to dismiss your student. They will need to come to the office to sign out first and then can be dismissed to you.
- Lastly, when checking out a student, please state the reason for the dismissal so the
 Attendance office can use the appropriate coding in the student record to prevent an absence
 code (AB). Some of the codes used are for appointment (MED), leaving town (VAC/OOT),
 personal (PEX), death/funeral (BER), injury (INJ), religious holiday (REL), visiting other school
 (OE), etc. This helps the student's attendance record be reflected as accurately as possible
 while helping to eliminate the push notifications received because of an undetermined
 absence.

We want to be sure to conduct productive methods in dismissing students so that we are efficient with everyone's time while minimizing calls and disruptions to our teachers in their classrooms. Thank you for your cooperation.
