

Music History Unit – Composer “Facebook Page” Poster Assignment

ITEM	Possible	
Composer Name – spelled correctly, etc.	10 points	use the most common spelling of your composer’s name
Profile Picture	10 points	use a photo or painting of your composer
Cover Photo	5 points	include a photo of an important place to that composer or other artwork that relates to him/her
Intro: Occupation	5 points	most will be listed as “composer,” but if your composer held a different job or a specific music-related job, use that. (ex. Professor of Music at University of Awesome)
Intro: Education	5 points	If you find out where your composer studied music (or anything else), include that (ex. “Studied [subject] at [place/school])
Intro: Lived in	5 points	the city where he/she spent most of their life. If there are many, use the place they lived when they died.
Intro: Relationship Status/Birthday	5 points	List their wife/husband’s name (if they had one) and the most approximate birthday you can find.
Friends	10 points	include pictures and names of 3-4 other composers who lived around the same time and in the same area of the world. If your composer was friends with any other famous historical figures (world leaders, etc.) you can include those, too.
Check-Ins/Places	5 points	where would your composer have “checked in”? Remember, Facebook lists things in reverse order with the most recent at the top. List 2-3 places (cities, concert halls, etc.) where your composer was or may have been.
Likes/Interests	5 points	list any hobbies your composer had. If you cannot find any, use your best judgment – what do you think they would have been interested in? You can also list other composer’s music who might have been an influence on your composer
Wall – interesting facts in “status update” language, approximate dates	5 points per post (25 total)	List status updates from your composer. Again, remember to list them in REVERSE order with the most recent at the top. Include approximate dates. You can include pictures and even “postings” by other composers. For example (post by the composer): “Just finished my ninth symphony. I think you’re really going to love the surprise at the ending!” (Post by another composer): “Loved hearing your new opera last night!” When you can, try to use specific composition titles. Include at least 5 status updates.
QR code	10 points	put a QR code at the bottom of your page that links to a recording of their music (like a link to YouTube, Naxos Music Library, etc.) There are many free apps that allow you to create and print QR codes.
