### Reading Strategies Predict/Infer

- What does the title tell you?
- What do you learn from the illustrations?
- What do you think will happen next? Why?
- What did you learn about the characters in the story?

#### Question

 What questions did you ask yourself as you were reading?

#### Monitor/Clarify

- Did you ask yourself if what you were reading made sense?
- Did you learn what you wanted to learn?
- What did you do when you didn't understand part of the story?

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#### Summarize

- What was the story mainly about?
- What were the important parts of what you read?

#### Evaluate

- How do you feel about what you read?
- Do you agree or disagree with it?
- Did you learn what you wanted to know?
- Did the author do a good job?

#### Phonics/Decoding

When you come to a word you don't know-

- 1. Look carefully at the word.
- 2. Look for word parts you know and think about the sounds for the letters.
- 3. Blend the sounds to read the word.
- 4. Ask yourself: Is it a word I know? Does it make sense in what I am reading?
- 5. If not, ask yourself: What else can I try?

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- 1. Wait and see if they work it out.
- 2. Say, "Try that again."
- 3. Say, "Look at the picture."
- 4. Say, "Think what would make sense."
- 5. Say, "Read the sentence again and start with the tricky word.
