

Diversity, Equity & Inclusion Recap 2022-2023

Did you know that OTE is one of the most diverse schools in the Blue Valley School District? In addition to being a Title I school, OTE has students from 28 different countries who speak 29 different languages. Our unique population is something we value and celebrate at OTE!

During the school year, OTE's first DEI (Diversity, Equity, Inclusion) parents council was organized as a way for parents and caregivers from all backgrounds to provide input related to school events, activities, and day-to-day operations. This council is the first of its kind in the school district and we are excited to lead the way in building belonging.

eedback was provided at the parents meetings held and an action plan was developed. This action plan included improvements within the school and PTO (Parent Teacher Organization) to foster a more inclusive community at OTE. The DEI action plan also included input from and is well supported by OTE administration, teachers, and staff.

From the action plan, the following has been implemented @ OTE during the 2022-2023 school year:

- . Create signage e vincos
 Signs created to remind visitors to the school of photo ID requirement and how to buzz the office for entry.
 Indoor signage created to clearly label rooms and teacher classrooms in the building, with teachers photos also displayed for easy recognition by students and visitors.
 Video in process to demonstrate the process of drop-off and pick-up of students using the car lanes.
 Video in process to showcase what a typical day at school looks like as a help for newcomers and their families.

- 2. Create visual documents
- Documents created with images/pictures to better show/explain: school supply list, nut safer list, birthday treats allowed,

- Welcome process enhanced for new students through improvements to mid-year enrollment process.
 School supply packs available to teachers so they can easily prepare for new students who arrive mid-school year.
- Welcome Club created to leverage language and culture experience of older students at OTE to help newcomers, particularly those students who speak a language other than English at home.

Student Code of Conduct


The Blue Valley Board of Education approved updates to Board Policy <u>3500</u> - Behavior and Discipline at the August 14, 2023 Board of Education meeting. As part of this approval, there is a <u>Student Code of Conduct</u> document. We ask all families and students within our school community to review the contents, policies, and procedures within this <u>Student Code of Conduct</u>.

Administrative actions taken as a result of a violation of the code of conduct are determined following proper investigation, review, and/or consideration of the age/grade of the student, context, and situation in which the behavior in question occurred. The scope of authority of the Blue Valley Student Code of Conduct applies at all times when students are on school buses or other vehicles used by the district to transport students, school district property, or engaged in official school activities. Additionally, this code of conduct applies to any student whose conduct at any time or place has a direct and immediate effect causing substantial disruption impacting the order of school operations and/or the sense of student and staff safety that exists in the school or school-related environment.



Students at Overland Trail Elementary have been made aware of behavioral expectations and the Code of Conduct through grade-level meetings, class meetings, and school-wide assemblies.

Important Travel Outside of the USA

This important message is for any family or staff that will **travel out of the United States** during the school year. Please <u>click here</u> to read the restrictions and recommendations for Out of the Country travel. Blue Valley resources such as Canvas, Classlink, and school email are not accessible out of the country unless you have a **personal device** with a **VPN**on it.

School Health Program Required Health Records

We welcome your child to the Blue Valley School District! Student health requirements are important as we partner with our families to create a safe and effective learning environment. All health forms **must** be completed and returned to the school nurse prior to the first day of school.

All students under nine years of age who are new to the state of Kansas are **required** to present documentation of a physical examination by an authorized health professional (K.S.A. 72-5214) that has been conducted no more than one year prior to enrollment. **Failure to provide this documentation will result in the exclusion of the student from school beginning Wednesday, September 6.** As an alternative to the required health assessment, a student may present:

- 1. A written statement signed by one parent or guardian that the child is an adherent of a religious denomination whose religious teachings are opposed to such assessments; or
- 2. A written statement signed by one parent or guardian that such assessment will be scheduled and completed within 90 days after admission to the school.

OTE | Title | School

Dear Families:

Overland Trail Elementary School has been identified as an official Title I school, based on the percentage of students who qualify for free or reduced lunch benefits. Title I is a federal program where select schools receive targeted funds to provide additional reading support. Federal guidelines mandate that Title I schools provide parents with a "right to know." As a parent, you have the right to know information regarding qualifications of your child's classroom teachers. This information can be found at https://appspublic.ksde.org/TLL/SearchLicense.aspx.

As a parent, you also have the right to view both district and building report cards, which can be found by going to www.bluevalleyk12.org, scrolling down to "District Quick Links" and selecting "Accountability Reports." Parents also have the right to request access to students' state assessment scores. These will also be shared via the KITE Parent Portal around the end of the school year.



Arrival and Dismissal Procedures


Arrival Procedures:

- 1. Our school doors open at 8:25 AM. Children should not arrive before 8:25 AM.
- 2. School begins at 8:40 AM. After 8:40 AM, students are considered tardy. A parent or guardian must come to the school's front entrance with their photo id to have their child signed in if they arrive at school later than 8:40 AM.
- 3. The crosswalk will be closed starting at 8:25 AM. If your student needs extra assistance, park in the parking lot closest to the playground. Do not park in the main parking lot.
- 4. Students should remain buckled in their seats until the vehicle stops in the traffic loop.
- 5. Cell phones should not be used while in the traffic loop.



Dismissal Procedures:

- 1. **Dismissal begins at 3:30 PM.** Our goal is to complete dismissal by 4:00 PM.
- 2. Students who walk home will exit the building through the exit doors on the North side of the building.
- 3. Students who walk home cannot stay on the OTE campus. Y-Care utilizes the building and playground after school, Monday-Friday.






General Reminder for Visitors During the School Day

Parents and Caregivers,

Our office staff wants to share a general reminder that all elementary schools in the district utilize the buzz-in entry system for visitors during the school day. Visitors will need to come to the front of the school. At the front entrance, visitors will press the buzzer, show government-issued photo identification, and state the purpose of their visit each time they visit the school. If you arrive without identification, the office will seek the administration's approval for entry.

Birthday Policy


Due to the growing number of food allergies and medical needs of students, OTE has a non-edible treat policy. Students may bring non-edible birthday treats (e.g., pencils, stickers, etc.) per arrangement with the classroom teacher. Remember that a birthday celebration should not take away from instructional time.

Birthday Invitations: We ask that students not distribute invitations to private birthday parties at school unless every class member receives an invitation.



Nut-Safer Guidelines

At OTE, we have a wide variety of food allergens and restrictions. To remain safe and to prevent exclusion, we don't accept food, including items from the Nut-Safe List, to serve in school or send home with students for birthday celebrations. This complies with our non-edible birthday celebration. Essentially, we must remember that sending food home is a risk for children as they transition between school and home, putting our families in an undesirable position when they cannot eat what is provided.
