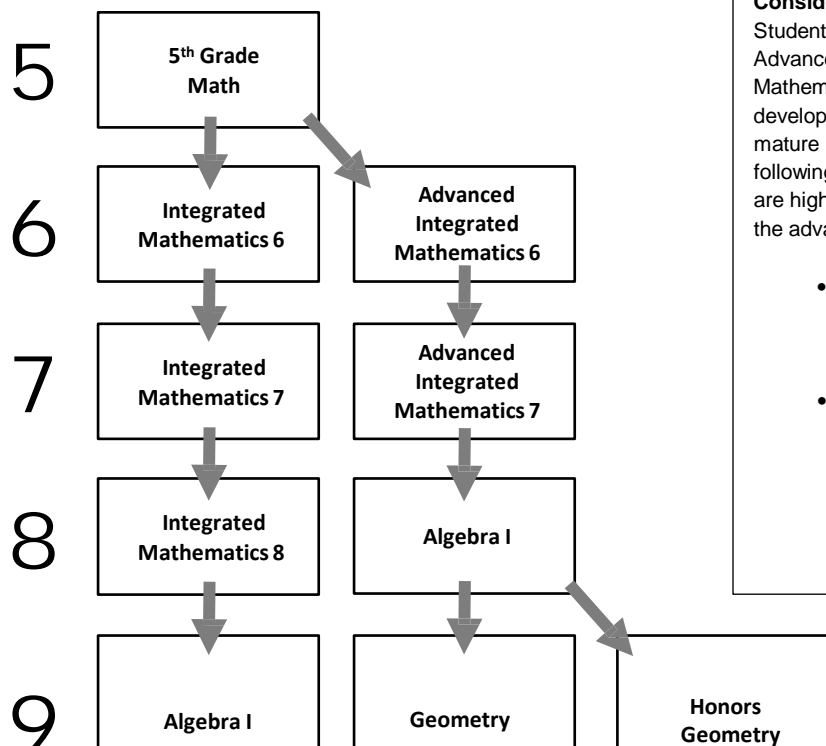

Dear Families:

As we begin the enrollment process, we want you to be aware of the math progression as a student transitions from elementary to middle to high school. The chart below details the math progression from 5th grade math into high school.

The requirement for graduation from a high school in the Blue Valley School District is 3 credits (6 semesters of passing grades) in math courses at the high school. Pre-Algebra does not count towards Board of Regents requirements.

For Board of Regents qualified admissions into a Regents' University, students graduating from an accredited Kansas High School must have an ACT score of 21 or higher or an SAT score of 980 or higher, or complete 4 credits of Math including Algebra 1, Geometry, Algebra 2, with one unit taken in the graduating year.



Considering Moving to Advanced Math?

Students may move from Integrated Mathematics 6 to Advanced Integrated Mathematics 7 or from Integrated Mathematics 7 to Algebra 1. Some students become more developmentally ready for **advanced** math classes as they mature and grow; so, a move to an advanced class the following year is possible, but the following considerations are highly-recommended in order to best ensure success in the advanced course:

- There are two distinct curricula for regular and advanced classes, so moving to an advanced class **will create some learning and knowledge gaps**.
- This gap will have to be addressed on the student's time before the beginning of the following school year. **Students may fill this gap by attending a summer course that Blue Valley offers.** Costs will be determined by summer school.
