New Policy - Gaming on District Devices

Effective January 4, 2024 - In an effort to reduce distractions in the learning environment for all or our students, general gaming websites will be blocked on district devices (examples include: Fortnite, <u>crazygames.com</u>, recreational games, arcade-like games, etc). Educational games will still be allowed.

Attendance Notifications and Reporting

Families can expect automated attendance messages by email, phone, and text if a child is absent and their absence has not already been reported by a parent/guardian. It is the responsibility of the parent/guardian to report an absence or reply to the automated email or phone message.

What is the purpose of attendance notifications?

We realize that students may occasionally need to miss school for planned absences, illnesses, and appointments. However, when a student does not arrive at school or unexpectedly misses a portion of the school day, we are concerned and want to make sure you are aware that your child is absent.

How can I get push notifications?

Families who would also like a push notification can download the ParentVUE app and manage their notifications. If a child has an unreported absence when a teacher submits attendance, then a push notification will immediately be sent to the parent/guardian's mobile device.

Interested in push notifications? Simply download the ParentVUE app (<u>iTunes app store</u> or <u>Google</u> <u>Play</u>), enable push notifications in device settings and select attendance notifications through in-

How do I report an absence?

When a student will be absent, parents should report their absence to the building by calling our phone line at 913-239-3701, or by emailing <u>attendancebvw@bluevalleyk12.org</u> in advance of the absence. Parents and Guardians may also enter full day absences into ParentVUe.

How do I call my student out for an appointment?

When students need to leave during the day for an appointment, contact with the attendance office **TWO HOURS prior to the absence** is requested. The office will then deliver a pass to the student. Any student leaving the building once the day has begun, must sign out in the attendance office and then sign in upon return. Students are able to then leave the building and drive themselves or meet their parent/guardian in the front circle. Parents do not need to come into the building to sign out students.

If a student becomes ill during the day - they must see the nurse. Mrs. Newton will assess the student and then issue a pass for them to go home after making communication with parents/guardians.

Fostering a Safe School Environment

Thank you for your help in making our district events a great experience for all who attend. We hope to see your family cheering for our Blue Valley teams this school year.


