

2nd Semester Parent-Teacher Conferences - February 5th - February 8th

The purpose of February conferences are to support your student in a class (or classes) that they may be having particular difficulties in. A conference can be set up to give you, your student, and the teacher time to talk about difficulties and plan for how to best support them to find success.

Not every parent may feel a conference is necessary at this time. If this is the case for you, you may check your student's progress via Canvas and talk with your student. If you have any questions, please email their teacher.

We are offering a combination of **virtual** (via Zoom) and **in-person 5-10-minute** conferences in February and spots are limited.

Blue Valley Northwest will be offering Wednesday, February 7th from 3:15-6:45 as an opportunity for parents to conference with teachers either in person or virtually via Zoom.

Teachers will be offering another evening the week of February 5th-February 8th where they will be available only in a virtual/Zoom format.


Gold Out Is Back!

Some February Celebrations & Observances:

- Black History Month created to celebrate the achievements, contributions, and rich cultural heritages of African Americans.
 Black History Month highlights the triumphs and adversities that have helped shape the United States.
- World Hijab Day February 1 this day recognizes the millions
 of Muslim women who choose to wear the hijab. Inviting
 women of all identities to wear the hijab for one day, it
 promotes understanding of other cultures and personal
 freedoms of religious expression.
- Lunar New Year February 10 celebrated by families of Chinese and other Asian heritages, some people celebrate with religious ceremonies honoring ancestors, giving and receiving red envelopes containing small amounts of money, lighting colorful lanterns, and eating traditional foods such as dumplings and sticky rice balls that symbolize family unity.
- Ash Wednesday February 14 a Christian holiday signifying the first day of the Lenten season, the 40 days (excluding Sundays) leading to Easter. Some families will attend religious services and receive ashes in the shape of a cross on their forehead.
- Magha Puja Day February 24 an important Buddhist festival celebrating the gathering between Buddha and his first disciples. Some families will attend temple, meditate, listen to teachings, perform giving alms, and hold candlelight processions.

<u>JCCC College Now & Baker University Concurrent Credit Information – 2nd semester classes</u>

JCCC's College Now and Baker CCCP are a dual or concurrent credit options for students in approved classes at BVNW. What is dual credit? When a high school student takes an approved BVNW HS class from an approved high school teacher, they have the option to earn both high

school and college credit. Students must enroll separately through JCCC or Baker University to earn the college credit.

BVNW Baker Concurrent Credit Program In-Person Class (2nd semester)

Enroll online through **Baker CCP Website** by **FEBRUARY 2**.

<u>College Board AP Exam Registration – opens January 29</u>

Students who are taking a **2nd-semester-only** AP course and plan to take the AP exam(s) must register and pay for exams by **February 29, 2024**. There are 2 parts to registering for an AP exam:

- 1. Confirming exam registration in AP Classroom (through student's College Board account)
- 2. Paying for the exam through <u>Total Registration</u>.

AP exam cost is \$108. Detailed instructions on how to register and pay can be found on <u>BVNW</u> <u>Counseling Canvas Course</u>.

**Students who missed the 1st semester registration deadline (for 1st semester and/or yearlong AP classes) and would like to take an AP exam, may register during this window. College Board charges a \$40 late registration fee. Student needs to pay for the AP exam through Total Registration, and then Mrs. Hadley, counselor, will update student's registration/exam order on College Board side.

Dropping classes

If a student chooses to drop a class, a "W" for the withdrawal will be recorded on their transcript. The last day to drop a second semester class is March 22, 2024. After this date, a student will stay in the class and keep the grade earned.
