Some March Celebrations & Observances:

- Women's History Month recognizes the achievements and contributions of women to society, culture, and American history. Women's History Month coincides with International Women's Day on March 8.
- World Teen Mental Wellness Day March 2 aims to raise awareness and decrease the stigma of mental health issues among teenagers.



- Ramadan evening of March 10-April 9 the holy month of fasting for the Islamic faith. For some Muslim families, it is a time for introspection, communal prayer, reading the Qur'an, and fasting between sunrise and sunset.
