The 2023 Horizon yearbook will be distributed to those who pre-purchased a yearbook on Friday, May 12.

**Seniors** will receive their book at the senior picnic in the new main gym Friday morning. Seniors who did not pre-purchase a yearbook may buy any extra books, if there are any, on a first come first served basis for \$50 in cash only. Seniors must have a photo ID in order to pick up their yearbook. Students may use their photo on StudentVue on their phone or a driver's license or their school ID.

**Non seniors** will receive their books Friday afternoon in the auxiliary gym and then proceed to the old main gym for a signing party. Any non-senior student who wishes to still purchase a yearbook, if there are any extras, may do so beginning Monday, May 15 after school in room 901. Books will be sold for \$50 cash only on a first come first served basis until they are gone. Students must have a photo ID in order to pick up their yearbook. Students may use their photo on StudentVue on their phone or a driver's license or their school ID.

Any student who pre-purchased a yearbook and misses school Friday may pick up their yearbook in room 901 beginning after school (2:45 p.m.) Monday. No yearbooks will be distributed during school. They will only be distributed before school or after school.
