Gregory Shuey, USAF (Ret) is a 1968 Air Force Academy graduate, a highly decorated Vietnam war veteran, instructor, fighter and functional test pilot with nearly 3,000 hours in 13 different aircraft. He was the former Air Force Director of Engineering for the Space Shuttle Program (Johnson Space Center), Navy FLTSATCOM Satellite Engineering Manager, A-10 pilot and war planner, and negotiator for US Forces, Korea. He is also an Air Force Academy Liaison Officer and President of the Air Force Academy Association of Graduates, Kansas City Chapter.

Presenters: Twelve graduates from the U.S. Military Academy, U.S. Naval Academy and U.S. Air Force Academy will be presenting displays of their careers and talking one-on-one with attendees about their experiences at their respective academy, their military professions and their follow-on civilian careers.
