 ESSENTIAL QUESTIONS How does one best access the required information? How does one verify this is a valid, reliable, relevant and appropriate source? How does one identify the best tools and strategies to obtain information effectively and efficiently? 	 7th Grade Compares potential usefulness of various information resources. 8th Grade Evaluates multiple information resources for accuracy, relevancy, authoritativeness, biases and stereotypes, and selects the best resources.



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INQUIRY & RESEARCH

STANDARD 2 Evaluates information critically and competently.	 The Student: 6th Grade Identifies information as fact, point of view and opinion.
 ESSENTIAL QUESTIONS How does one know which resources best fit his/her information needs? 	 Expands note-taking skills using paraphrasing and summarizing. Structures a thesis statement to answer essential questions. Practices distinguishing between reliable and accurate sources.
 How does one organize information for his/her research? How does one apply the information as evidence for his/her research? 	 7th Grade Determines inaccurate and misleading information. Uses note taking skills to organize and categorize relevant information. Provides evidence to support a thesis statement. 8th Grade Distinguishes information for accuracy, relevancy, authoritativeness, biases and stereotypes. Utilizes notes to synthesize information appropriate to the problem or question. Uses evidence to draw conclusions and form opinions related to thesis statement.



USE OF INFORMATION

ESSENTIAL QUESTIONS How and why does one respect intellectual property? How does one maintain accurate and ethical records of his/her sources? How does one share information, effectively, in an original way? 	 The Student: 6th Grade Understands intellectual property rights, copyright, fair use and plagiarism. Identifies parts of a citation. Uses proper citation formats. Collaborates to gather, present, and share new learning. 7th Grade Recognizes and uses methods of ethical research including paraphrasing and using direct quotes. Uses MLA format to cite a variety of sources. Uses parenthetical citations. Collaborate and/or work independently to design and create a product as evidence of learning for an audience.
	 8th Grade Demonstrates an understanding of intellectual property rights, copyright, fair use and plagiarism. Independently uses MLA format. Independently works to creates a product, and shares knowledge for a new meaning.

	 8th Grade Reads self-selected texts that go beyond the curriculum while recognizing that authors express personal viewpoints in their writing.

Transfers current knowledge to learn new technology tools. 8th Grade
