## SUPPORT FOR STUDENTS WHOSE FAMILIES HAVE LOST THEIR HOMES TO FORECLOSURE

If your family owned its home and lost it to foreclosure, or if your family was renting a home and the landlord lost it to foreclosure, and you are now living in a temporary situation, your preschool-aged and schoolaged children may qualify for certain rights and protections under the McKinney-Vento Act.

## Eligible children and youth have the right to:

Go to school, no matter where they live or how long they have lived there.

RECLOSUR

- Continue attending their school of origin or be enrolled immediately in the local school where they are living, depending on their best interest; the school of origin is the school the student attended before losing housing or the school the student last attended; the student can attend the school of origin even if he/she now lives outside that district's lines.
- Receive transportation to and from the school of origin at no cost to the parent or student.
- Enroll in the new local school immediately, even if missing records and documents normally required for enrollment, such as a birth certificate, proof of residence, previous school records, or immunization/medical records.
- Enroll, attend classes, and participate fully in all school activities while the school gathers records.
- Have access to the same programs and services that are available to all other

students, including transportation and supplemental educational services.

Receive free school meals.

If you believe your child(ren) may be eligible for the support provided by the McKinney-Vento Act, contact the school district's Local Lialson or your State McKinney-Vento Coordinator.
