## Current Events

Each week, a few students will be responsible for sharing a current event with the class. The student will know far in advance which week they will present. Each student will have a chance to share a current event every quarter. This will be part of their Social Studies grade.

## Guidelines:

- 1. Your current event must be PRINTABLE. This means that it must come from a <u>newspaper</u>, a <u>news magazine</u> (such as *Time* or *Newsweek*), or a valid <u>online news source</u> (some useful sources are <u>www.usatoday.com</u>, <u>www.cnn.com</u>, <u>www.kansascity.com</u>, <u>www.msnbc.com</u>, and many more!). - 2. Don't wait until the last minute! You may start finding articles a week before you are supposed to present. Just make sure the article is not more than 7 days old at the time that you present.
- 3. When you find an article that interest you, cut it out <u>neatly</u> or print it out. Glue the article to a piece of colored construction paper or to a piece of white typing paper if you are cutting it from a newspaper or magazine.
- 4. Next, write a <u>summary</u> of your news article. Be sure to include WHO, WHAT, WHEN, WHERE, and WHY. Also include any other important details. Remember, this is just a summary and you do not need to write a book! One to two <u>quality</u> paragraphs will do. This can either be done <u>neatly</u> in ink (pen) on clean (not ripped out of notebook) notebook paper OR it may be typed.
- 5. Then, write a paragraph explaining your opinion of the article.
- 6. Attach your SUMMARY and OPINION to the NEWS ARTICLE and bring it to class on your assigned date.
- 7. You need to be prepared to present your article with the class. Be familiar with the article so you can answer questions anyone might have!
