WHAT'S THE STORY?

A brilliant, albeit socially inept, teenager named Christopher discovers the body of his neighbor's dead dog. The police mistake Christopher to be the murderer, and after his innocence is proven, he is determined to discover who the real dog-killer is. During his investigation, he discovers information about his mother that his father kept hidden. Devastated by this discovery, Christopher runs away from home and traverses across England in search of his mother.
