



Automotive Technology

Students in the Automotive Technology program spend half of the day at their high school and half of their day on campus at Johnson County Community College (JCCC)

working toward an associate degree or certificate options in the field of Automotive Repair. Students may receive dual credit at no cost to the student for successful completion of JCCC coursework.

JCCC entrance requirements must be met for College Algebra (ACT Math score of 26 or higher) and Composition 1 (ACT English score of 19 or higher).

- Automotive Engine Repair
