Challenges of the Week

Math Challenge of the Week: We have been working on time to the hour and half hour recently. Have your child write down different times to the hour or half hour throughout a day by looking at an analog clock. Or if you don't have an analog clock at your house, have them draw a clock and draw what different hour and half hour times look like. For more of a challenge, have them tell time to the minute on an analog clock instead!

Reading Challenge of the Week: We have been talking about the different kind of feelings the characters have in our books recently. Have your child identify the main character in a fiction book and then write down the different feelings that the character went through, throughout the book. Have them identify what caused their feelings to change as well.

Writing Challenge of the Week: We have been discussing the difference between reality and fantasy recently. Have your child write a short story that involves fantasy. We talked about how that means that something in the story couldn't happen in real life. For example... Talking animals / dinosaurs walking through a city / flying shoes / magical fish / etc.
