Challenges of the Week

Math Challenge of the Week: We are learning a lot about numbers that go up to 120. Some students struggle to write numbers past 100. Have your child write the numbers 90 to 120 down. Then have them solve these addition problems:

100+1= 105+1= 110+1= 115+1= 120+1=

For more of a challenge, have them create their own addition sentences in the 100's.

Reading Challenge of the Week: We started talking about headings while we read non-fiction books. Have your child read a non-fiction book and write down all of the headings they find in it as they are reading.

Writing Challenge of the Week: Have your child find a picture on the internet of something that interests them (with an adult helping). Then have them write a short story that includes what is in the picture! If possible, glue the picture to the top of their page! If not, not a big deal! Challenge them to write at least 5 sentences that include a beginning sentence, a problem, and a solution. Also challenge them to edit their writing themselves after reading it to you! Are they able to use capitals and periods where needed? Did they stretch out their sounds as much as possible on each word? Does their story make sense?
