Challenges of the Week

Math Challenge – We have been identifying what the value of a number is for the ones and tens place. Have your child write down these numbers and underline the number that is underlined. Then have them identify what the value is of that number (ex: $\frac{4}{2}$ = 40 / $3\frac{6}{6}$ = 6). For more of a challenge, have your child try to do this same thing with numbers in the 100's.

Reading Challenge – Have your child read a non-fiction book. Then have them write notes while they read. We have been working hard on the proper way to take notes (title on top, bullet points, skip lines between notes, only writing important information, etc).

Writing Challenge - We have been writing letters to different teachers to learn the proper way to write a letter. Have your child write me a letter in their notebook. Do they have the date in the top right side? Do they have a greeting that starts with 'Dear'? Did they put a comma after 'Mrs. Weeks'? Did they go to the next line after the greeting instead of starting the letter on the same line? Do they have a closing (From, Sincerely, Love) on the bottom with a comma after it? Do they have their own name on the very bottom of the letter?
