Challenges of the Week

Math Challenge of the Week: Let your child choose what they want to practice at home from the list below! Have them create their own problems and solve it on their own! Depending on the type of problems they decide on, they need to do anywhere between 3-10 problems.

Double digit addition double digit subtraction (no regrouping) multiplication measurement rounding time to the half hour

Reading Challenge of the Week: We have been identifying books that have words that are supposed to be 'sound words'. We learned that these words are called onomatopoeia words. Have your child read different books and make a list of onomatopoeia words! Here are some examples: sizzle, boom, crackle, bam, swish, knock

Writing Challenge of the Week: We have been practicing writing stories on Microsoft Word using our Chromebooks recently. We have played around with different fonts and colors while doing this. We also learned how to correct words that have a red line under them. Have your child write a short story on Microsoft Word and print it off! No need for a picture unless they want to add one after they print off their story. They can tape or glue the story in their homework notebook.
