App of the Week: <u>Brain Tuner</u> is great for addition and subtraction practice. Students have to decide whether a number sentence is right or wrong. Students can't go onto the next level until they have done well on the previous level. It starts with addition, then subtraction, and then a mixture of addition and subtraction.

Challenges of the Week

Math Challenge of the Week: We have been talking about fact families recently. Students come up with 4 number sentences that are all part of a fact family (2 addition and 2 subtraction sentences). Have your child come up with an addition sentence and then have them write down the rest of the fact family. Have them do this at least 3 times. Here is an example:

4+3=7

3+4=7

7-3=4

7-4=3

Remind them of this: A part + a part = a whole A whole - a part = a part

Reading Challenge of the Week: Recently we have been talking a lot about proper nouns and discussing how they are nouns that need to be capitalized. As your child is reading a book, have them make a list of proper nouns they find in it. Examples: Mrs. Weeks, Harmony Elementary, Overland Park, Snoopy, Taco Bell, etc.

Writing Challenge of the Week: We have been discussing recipes and the differences between ingredients and directions. The students wrote ingredients and directions on how they think a turkey should be cooked. Have your child write the ingredients and directions on how to make a peanut butter and jelly sandwich (or something they know how to make). Make sure in the directions they use transitional words such as first, next, then, finally.
