App of the Week: <u>Counting Money</u> is a great app because you can set it up as hard or easy as your child needs. Students learn the value of the coins and learn how to count mixed coins at the same time. For most of the class, I would suggest doing the beginner level, 10 questions, timer off, and DO show the coins total to start off with on the settings.

Challenges of the Week

Math Challenge of the Week: We will be starting to work on math fluency to the number 10 soon. I will be looking to see if students need manipulatives to solve simple addition and subtraction sentences or if they can solve it in their head. Give your child these addition problems and watch how they solve them. Do they need to use their fingers, draw pictures, or use items to help solve them? Or can they solve them relatively quickly without any help. Write down what they used to help them solve the problems (write down 'in head' if no things were used). For more of a challenge, give them subtraction problems. 1+4, 8+2, 5+3, 7+1, 3+3, 2+6, 9+1, 4+3, 1+5, 3+7

Reading Challenge of the Week: Have your child find a non-fiction book that has captions. Have them read all of the captions in the book. Then have them pick out their favorite one. They can write down what the caption says in their notebooks!

Writing Challenge of the Week: We have been practicing editing our writing AS we write rather than waiting until we finish writing our stories. Have your child write about whatever they want. WHILE they are writing, have them go back and reread to you what they wrote to make sure it makes sense and to see if they need to make any corrections. Do this a couple of times while they write to help them get used to stopping in the middle of their writing to check how the story sounds so far.
