Challenges of the Week

Math Challenge of the Week: Last week we worked with a ten frame to visually see what numbers look like. A ten frame is 10 boxes (5 on top and 5 on bottom) with different numbers of counters (circles) filling the boxes. We created addition sentences 2 different ways. One way is we added the top row plus the bottom row of counters to find out how many counters in all. Another way is to add the number of filled boxes plus the number of empty boxes to see how many boxes there are in all. Go to the website listed below to see an online lesson I created. It will explain this better! Create around 3 ten frames and fill them with different number of counters. Then have your child come up with 1 or 2 addition sentences to go with each ten frame. Reading Challenge of the Week: Students can visualize while they read. For example, the students read a paragraph and visualized what was happening in that paragraph in their heads while listening. Then they drew a picture of what they saw in their heads. Read a few pages of a book to your child without them looking at the pictures. Then have them draw a picture in their homework notebook what they visualized while listening to what you read. Have them write the title of the book at the top of the page as well.

Writing Challenge of the Week: Have your child recall 3 things they did one day this week. Have them use words such as first, next, then, finally, to share what they did. You can make this as simple (1 sentence) or hard (5 or more sentences) as your child can handle. Most students are writing around 3 sentences right now.
