Challenges of the Week

Math Challenge: We are about to finish Topic 2 in math that has many subtraction activities. Have your child come up with subtraction story problems (at least 2 of them) with something being taken away. Here is an example: Michelle had 7 rubber bands. Then she lost 4 of them! How many rubber bands does Michelle have now? To make it more difficult, have them come up with comparison story problems instead. For example: I have 15 rubber bands. Ashley has 12 rubber bands. How many more rubber bands do I have than Ashley? (To solve, students take the highest amount minus the lower amount to find the difference).

Reading Challenge: We have been identifying the main characters in books and deciding whether they would be a friend we would want to have or not. Have your child read a book, identify the main characters, and write about whether they would want to be friends with them in real life or not. Have them give reasons why they would or would not want to be friends with them.

Writing Challenge: Go to <u>THIS</u> (below) website and have your child spin to create a writing prompt! There are SUPER fun writing prompts here that will allow your child's imagination to run wild while they write! Have your child write a short story using the writing prompt that they got! This may be challenging for some so don't worry about doing this if it is too difficult.
