Challenges of the Week

Math Challenge of the Week: Have your child come up with story problems that includes 2 things joining together. For example: I have 8 lollipops. Then my friend gave me 4 more. How many lollipops do I have now? If needed, you can write the story out that your child tells you. You can make this as hard (higher numbers) or easy (lower numbers) as you think your child can handle. You could also have them use more than 2 numbers.

Reading Challenge of the Week: During reading groups, we are talking about 5 strategies to use when they get stuck on a word. 1. Put your finger under the word. 2. Get your mouth ready 3. Think about what makes sense. 4. Look at the picture. 5. Find a chunk in the word that you know. While reading with your child this week, see which strategy your child used when they got stuck on a word. They may have had to use more than 1 strategy on a word! Have them write about which strategy they used and what word they used it on. For more of a challenge, have a student find a super challenging word in the dictionary and try to pronounce it. What word did they choose? What strategy helped them?

Writing Challenge of the Week: Finding a comfortable place to write can help your child write better sometimes. Have your child find a comfortable place to write around your house. Where did they decide to write? What materials did they bring with them to their writing spot? Did it help them write better? Have your child write down where they picked to write and what things they brought with them!
