## **End of Quarter Information - Canvas Courses**

At the end of each quarter, most courses in Canvas will conclude and will no longer be visible on the Canvas app. A concluded course is only visible through the Canvas website, by selecting All Courses on the Courses tab and scrolling down to the "Past Enrollments" section. Courses for this quarter will conclude on October 14th, 11:59pm. Report cards will be generated and available on ParentVUE at the end of the school day, October 22nd after 4pm. Each new quarter, teachers will publish a Canvas course for the new quarter. As courses are published, students and families will again be able to see current courses on the Canvas app and Canvas website. ## **WE Survey Information for Families**

Families, we want to know more about your student(s)' experiences in our school. To better understand, we are asking our students (grades 3-12), staff, and families to provide us with anonymous feedback regarding their perceptions of the learning environment, quality of instruction, and leadership at our school.

The **WE Learn Student Survey** is an anonymous, perceptual survey intended for grades 3-12. It includes about 50 items, each rated on a Likert scale, and will take approximately 10-15 minutes to complete.

Examples of survey items include, but are not limited to:

- This school has high expectations for all students.
- My teachers present lessons in different ways.
- My teachers know my academic interests and goals.

You will have an opportunity to provide your feedback as well. Starting November 1st through November 15th, our students' families can participate in the WE Support Survey. This perceptual, anonymous, voluntary survey, is similar. The survey contains about 50 questions, rated on a Likert scale, and will take approximately 10 - 15 minutes to complete. The results will help us to better understand our community's perceptions of the school experience and their expectations of our school. Be on the lookout for additional information to come when the survey window opens on November 1st.

#### A couple of items to note:

- Please log into ParentVue to either opt your student into participating or opt your student out of participating.
- Participation is entirely voluntary. Upon logging into ParentVue, a screen will pop up, and families will have the opportunity to record their decision. Only students whose families give permission (select, "I DO give permission...") to participate will participate. This means, for your student to participate, you must log in to ParentVue and select the option, "I DO give permission for my child(ren) to participate in the WE Learn Survey," on the consent form that pops up.
- Implementation reflects a Kansas State Department of Education requirement for school districts to collect data on instructional practices as well as the learning environment.

## Girls Basketball starts soon!



### 6th Grade News

#### ELA:

ELA students have learned so much this quarter. They finished strong by writing a personal narrative about a conflict they have experienced in their lives. Students incorporated plot, conflict, characterization, theme, point of view, and dialogue into this writing assignment. It was great reading the final products and seeing how much the students have grown in their writing skills in just one quarter! Have your student share their personal narrative with you – we think you will be impressed!

Math:

Math ended the quarter playing Battleship to practice graphing on a coordinate plane. We will start learning about absolute value and inequalities next week to kick of quarter two.

#### **Social Studies:**

This week we finished our Empire simulation. Ask your child which group won in their hour. We are looking forward to starting our ancient Egypt unit next week.

#### **Choir:**

Concert week has arrived!

**Tuesday, October 19** 6th grade choir students stay after school until 4:00pm for a combined rehearsal in the commons. *Please have a ride home for the end of rehearsal at 4:00pm.* **Wednesday, October 20** is our concert! Families should drop of choir students at the back entrance of the school (south side) at 6:30pm. Students should arrive in our uniform of green music department polo shirt and black bottoms, black socks and black shoes. Families and friends should stay outside of the building until 6:50pm. At 6:50pm, audience members should proceed to the gym and the performance will begin at 7pm or once everyone is seated. Looking forward to an awesome performance!

#### 6th Grade Band

Our first band concert will be on **Weds Oct 20 at 6:00pm in the ABMS gym!** Students should arrive in time to be **seated in the gym at 5:30pm** for warm up, sound check, practice, and tuning. Students should wear their Green ABMS Music Polo with black pants and the darkest/cleanest shoes they have. (We have extra polos for those who haven't been able to get one! Or, students may wear a black top instead) The concert will last about 25 minutes; then, the orchestra will perform at 6:30, then the choir at 7:00. #### **6th Grade Orchestra**

## 7th Grade News

#### ELA:

Students are wrapping up their reading of *The Watsons Go to Birmingham-1963* as we end quarter 1 and begin quarter 2. We are so proud of the writers they are becoming! Next up: We will start quarter 2 with some basic grammar refreshers before we dive into research on London in the Victorian Era.

#### **Integrated Math:**

We are starting Unit 2, which is an intro to algebra. We will be evaluating expressions and solving equations!

#### **Advanced Math:**

Students just assessed over our Real Numbers unit. Next week, we are starting the next "Big Idea," which involves exploring patterns and identifying algebraic expressions.

#### Science:

Students had a fun "lab week!" Not only did they see the progress of bacteria and mold growth in their petri dishes, but they ALSO got to see microorganisms from pond water under the microscope. Next week, students will work on a brain injury project! Students will play neurosurgeon, and help diagnose and assess a brain injury for a patient and the family. They'll also bring in real-world information in finding out common treatments for these injuries as well. If you work in medicine, this is a perfect opportunity to share your professional experiences with your kid(s) to further develop their projects!

#### Social Studies:

**Redford & Squyres:** This week Social Studies classes developed and practiced map skills with a fun challenge to find a missing bobsled team. What a great end to the first quarter! Coming up next is a project to design their own country, with topography and everything! **We could use CLEAN, Large pizza boxes to hold their beautiful creations.** 

Fairburn: This week we started our unit on Physical Geography, and I'm testing out a way of teaching that I've never done before (a progressive mastery unit that is student-paced- "The Grid Method"). We're bringing in a ton of Earth Science to help us learn why climates are the way they are, and why people live where they do, one baby step at a time. There's even a lab involved! Who says science is only for science class?? So far the kids are doing extremely well with a very different way of learning that is at their own pace, and I'm mightily impressed. I'm getting amazing one-on-one time with the kids that need it, and students who grasp the concept(s) quickly can more forward through the unit at their discretion.
