

- *Cast and crew do not need a ticket. Crew may attend an evening performance and be seated in a crew section, so please do not purchase a ticket for them.


CAST: A new rehearsal calendar was distributed on Friday at rehearsal. It is also found on canvas and linked here:




Student Council is coming!

Student Services Snapshot

In September we started our monthly counseling lessons in flex. We also joined ELA classes in 6th and 8th grades to provide lessons related to the stories students were reading.

6th Flex lesson - Rumors

We discussed how rumors get started and the impact they can have on students. We also discussed how individual students can help prevent rumors from spreading. We supported ELA readings by talking with classes about perspective. We used optical illusions to talk about how we see things differently and how it is sometimes difficult to see another perspective. ELA teachers tied this to the perspective of different characters in their short story and how those perspectives impacted the characters' actions.

During flex we asked students to think about what is important to them and what they value. We discussed how values are personal and may differ from person to person and may also vary throughout our lives. For example, middle and high school students often value having lots of friends. Through discussion many students said that they could see having a few really good friends being more important as they get older. The discussion also included why knowing what we value is important. As we go through life and make decisions, staying true to what is important to us typically guides us in the correct direction. We encouraged students to visit at home about the things their families value and how those values have helped family members make decisions.

8th Flex lesson - Values

During flex we asked students to think about what is important to them and what they value. We discussed how values are personal and may differ from person to person and may also vary throughout our lives. For example, middle and high school students often value having lots of friends. Through discussion many students said that they could see having a few really good friends being more important as they get older. The discussion also included why knowing what we value is important. As we go through life and make decisions, staying true to what is important to us typically guides us in the correct direction. We encouraged students to visit at home about the things their families value and how those values have helped family members make decisions.

We supported ELA classes as they read *The Outsiders*. The discussion centered on grief and the losses various characters experienced and how each dealt with the grief from their loss.



6th Grade News

ELA:

Students are putting together all the skills we learned this quarter by writing their own personal narrative story about a conflict they have experienced in their past. We read and analyzed mentor texts to model the process in class. Students brainstormed their topic, completed a pre-writing graphic organizer, and began writing the personal narrative. The stories will include plot structure, conflict, characterization, point of view, and theme. Ask your student what conflict topic they picked to write about. The writing process, along with proofing, editing, and revising will continue next week as we finish the quarter strong in ELA!

Math classes started unit two this week. We learned about integers and used inequality signs to make comparisons between integers. Next week, we will practice graphing on a four-quadrant grid.

Science:

Math:

We will explore the Universe, rotation and revolution next week. Students will create models to help them learn the concepts.

Social Studies:

This week we continued our Mesopotamia Empires simulation. We traded resources, made ziggurats, and faced some battles. This next week is the end of our simulation. Ask your child how their team is doing. Do they think they are going to win? What could they do to help their team finish off strong? The Empire task will be due Oct. 11.

Can you believe it's already October?! The end of first quarter is next week!

ELA:

The 7th grade has started reading the novel "The Watsons Go to Birmgingham-1963" this week. We will continue reading this novel until the end of the quarter (wow, so close to the end!)

Integrated Math:

Next week we are starting Unit 2. Unit 2 is an intro to expressions, equations, and inequalities. We will be doing activities that involved identifying patterns and relating those changes to equations and expressions.

Advanced Math:

Do you know what 0.327272727...is as a fraction? Your student should be able to figure it out! We spent the week diving into classification of numbers and how to prove whether a decimal is rational or irrational! We'll have a short Assessment over classifying real numbers at the beginning of next week and then start introducing our Expressions, Equations and Inequalities unit by observing and creating patterns.

Science:

Due to the labs and projects we're doing, and needing to share equipment, the Science team is in slightly different places this week, but your student has, or will, participate in some really cool stuff this week or next. Part of the activity rotation is looking at pond water under the microscope and seeing all of the little microorganisms that live in the untreated water. They learn pretty quickly why you don't want to drink lake water when swimming! Another activity we're doing is brainstorming and swabbing what the kids think is the cleanest and dirtiest locations in the school to grow bacteria cultures on agar (bathrooms off limits). It's a Battle of the Bacteria between teams! We'll check the progress of the agar plates in a week and then again at the two week mark to see who had the cleanest and/or most diverse growth of bacteria!

Social Studies:

We assessed over the five themes of geography this week! Some classes found evidence of the five themes in current news articles while others planned where to survive a zombie apocalypse by evaluating their survival location options through the themes. All in all, very pleased with our students and their hard work to showcase evidence of their learning! Next we move on to map features and skills and then physical geography. How do landforms affect climate, and how does climate affect where people choose to live?

Choir:

Our first concert performance is Monday, October 11. Please arrive in uniform at SouthWest high school at the main entrance or the Performing Arts Center entrance and go the Performing Arts Center at 6:00pm. We will take group pictures for yearbook and prepare for our performance. The performance begins at 7:00pm. All attendees must wear masks.

8th Grade News

ELA:

This week 8th Graders are doing a Mini-Research Choice Board Project where they will choose a topic to research that had an impact on the world as we know it in the 1960s. We are making connections between the events in that decade and the characters from *The Outsiders*. 8th Graders were encouraged to talk to the adults in their life about what they might know/remember from the 1960s.

Farris Science:

Complete the Save the Penguins' Project. Every day will be a work day.

Moss Science:

Penguin Project testing, modifying, and retesting.

Math 8:

We will be simplifying and evaluating multi-step inequalities including situations that have the variable on both sides.

Algebra 1:

Will be moving into solving more complex equations. Including situations involving absolute value and square roots.

Social Studies:

Student's speeches as delegates are due Sunday 10/10 at midnight. Most students will be recording these speeches at home, taking the role of a Founding Father and explaining the Constitution to their "home states."
