Important Info About Courses and Grades in Canvas

The end of the first semester is nearly here. Our students have had a great first semester of learning and we continue to see the positive impacts of our learning management system, Canvas, in our classrooms. As we gear up for the end of the semester, please take note of the important information below regarding grades and courses in Canvas.

End of Semester Information

At the end of the day on Tuesday, December 21st, courses in Canvas will conclude and will no longer be visible on the Canvas Parent app. A concluded course is only visible through the Canvas Website. To view concluded courses, open Canvas in a web browser, log in, and click on the Courses tab. Click View All Courses and scroll down to find the past enrollments.

Math:

Math classes worked on a small decimal operation unit this week to wrap up the quarter. Students learned/recalled how to add, subtract, multiply, and divide with decimals. We hope you enjoy your winter break!

Social Studies:

We are anticipating the Ancient Greece Festival for our social studies classes on Tuesday, December 21st. It will include a Greek Olympic Quiz Bowl (intelligence strength), games, crafts, Olympic events, and a virtual reality tour. We are looking forward to a very enjoyable morning. Students will represent different city-states and portray different roles for their team.

Please encourage your children to dress accordingly (togas with school attire underneath, city-state t-shirts, etc.). We have been talking about this in class over the last couple of weeks. We would also like to **invite you to participate** in the Greek Olympic Quiz Bowl with us on the morning of the 21st. We would love to have a parent team competing against the student teams that morning. (Think of it as Trivial Pursuit, but Ancient Greek themed.) At some point between 7:55-10:20, your child will be in a 25 minute rotation competing in this quiz bowl.
